1. Resolutions and Presentations

The board postponed action on a resolution honoring Sharon Pierce, who is retiring as the state advisor of the Texas Association of Family Career and Community Leaders of America, because Mrs. Pierce was unable to attend the meeting.

2. Approval of Consent Agenda

Any agenda item may be placed on the Consent Agenda by any State Board of Education committee.

(1) Adoption of Review of 19 TAC Chapter 101, <u>Assessment</u> (Adoption of Review) (Committee on Instruction)

Texas Government Code, §2001.039, establishes a four-year rule review cycle for all state agency rules, including State Board of Education (SBOE) rules. The board approved the adoption of the review of 19 TAC Chapter 101, <u>Assessment</u>, Subchapter A, <u>General Provisions</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Implementation of Assessments</u>, and Subchapter C, <u>Local Option</u>. The rules address the development and administration of tests, voluntary assessment of private school students, the schedule for the release of tests, and administration and reporting of group-administered achievement tests.

(2) Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other Than English</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §114.1 and §114.2, Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §114.11 and §114.12, and Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, §§114.21-114.29 (First Reading and Filing Authorization) (Committee on Instruction)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization the proposed repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other than English</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §114.1 and §114.2, Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §114.11 and §114.12, and Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, §§114.21-114.29. The proposed repeal would remove the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) adopted to be effective in 1998 for elementary, middle, and high school languages other than English (LOTE) and related implementation language, as updated curriculum standards will replace them in the 2017-2018 school year.

(4) Adoption of Review of 19 TAC Chapter 109, <u>Budgeting</u>, <u>Accounting</u>, and <u>Auditing</u>

(Adoption of Review)

(Committee on School Finance/Permanent School Fund)

Texas Government Code, §2001.039, establishes a four-year rule review cycle for all state agency rules, including State Board of Education rules. The board approved the adoption of the review of 19 TAC Chapter 109, <u>Budgeting</u>, <u>Accounting</u>, and <u>Auditing</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Budgeting</u>, <u>Accounting</u>, <u>Financial Reporting</u>, and <u>Auditing for School Districts</u>; Subchapter B, <u>Texas Education Agency Audit Functions</u>; Subchapter C, <u>Adoptions By Reference</u>; and Subchapter D, <u>Uniform Bank Bid or Request for Proposal and Depository Contract</u>. These rules provide requirements for school districts relating to budgeting, accounting, financial reporting, and auditing; Texas Education Agency (TEA) financial review functions; adoption by reference of the *Financial Accountability System Resource Guide* (*FASRG*); and the bank bid and proposal forms and the depository contract and surety bond forms. The board ratified the purchases and sales of investments executed in the portfolio of the Permanent School Fund (PSF) for the months of December 2016, January and February 2017 in the amounts of \$820,188,573 and \$897,691,986, respectively.

The board voted to enter into a contract with Blackrock Investment Management, LLC for investment services for long-only passive international developed and emerging market equity for the Texas Permanent School Fund and approved authorization for contract execution by the commissioner of education. 3. Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 111, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, and Subchapter C, <u>High School</u> (First Reading and Filing Authorization)

By a vote of 5-9 with one abstention, the board considered but did not approve amendments to remove references to mathematical process standards from the knowledge and skills statements in the mathematics curriculum standards.

(Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved for second reading and final adoption 19 TAC Chapter 112, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Science, Subchapter A, Elementary, Subchapter B, Middle School, and Subchapter C, High School, as amended. The proposed amendments streamline the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for science with a recommended implementation date of the 2018-2019 school year.

Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 110, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for English Language Arts and Reading</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, and 19 TAC Chapter 128, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Spanish Language Arts and Reading and English as a Second Language</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>

(Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board approved amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 110, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for English Language Arts and Reading</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, and 19 TAC Chapter 128, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Spanish Language Arts and Reading and English as a Second Language</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>. However, the board postponed final approval of the rules, as amended, until a specially-called meeting at 8 a.m. May 10 to provide time for the board and the Texas Education Agency to ensure that the amendments have been accurately incorporated into the TEKS.

(First Reading and Filing Authorization)

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 110, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for English Language Arts and Reading, Subchapter C, High School, and Chapter 128, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Spanish Language Arts and Reading and English as a Second Language, Subchapter C, High School, as amended. The proposed revisions recommend an implementation date of the 2020-2021 school year.

8. Proposed New 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other Than English</u>, <u>Subchapter C, High School</u>, §114.53, <u>Advanced Language for Career Applications (One Credit)</u> (Second Reading and Final Adoption)

The board gave final approval of proposed new 19 TAC Chapter 114, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Languages Other than English</u>, Subchapter C, <u>High School</u>, §114.53, <u>Advanced Language for Career Applications (One Credit)</u>, as amended. The new rule implements House Bill (HB) 1431, 84th Texas Legislature, 2015, which requires the State Board of Education to develop an advanced languages other than English (LOTE) course that prepares students to communicate in a language other than English in a specific professional, business, or industry environment. The board did amend the rule to clarify that this course may not satisfy a high school languages other than English graduation credit or a LOTE requirement for an endorsement.

The amendments add student expectations for prescription drug awareness to the health education Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) in accordance with Senate Bill (SB) 968, 84th Texas Legislature, 2015.
