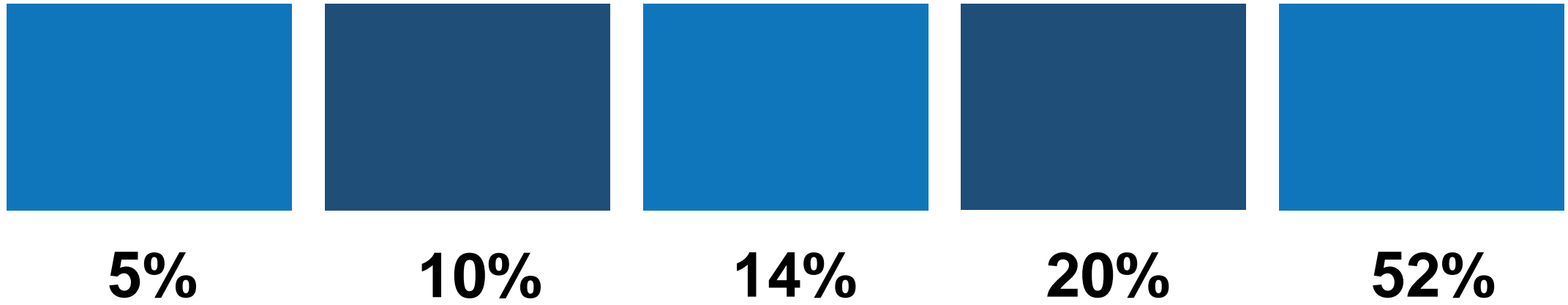

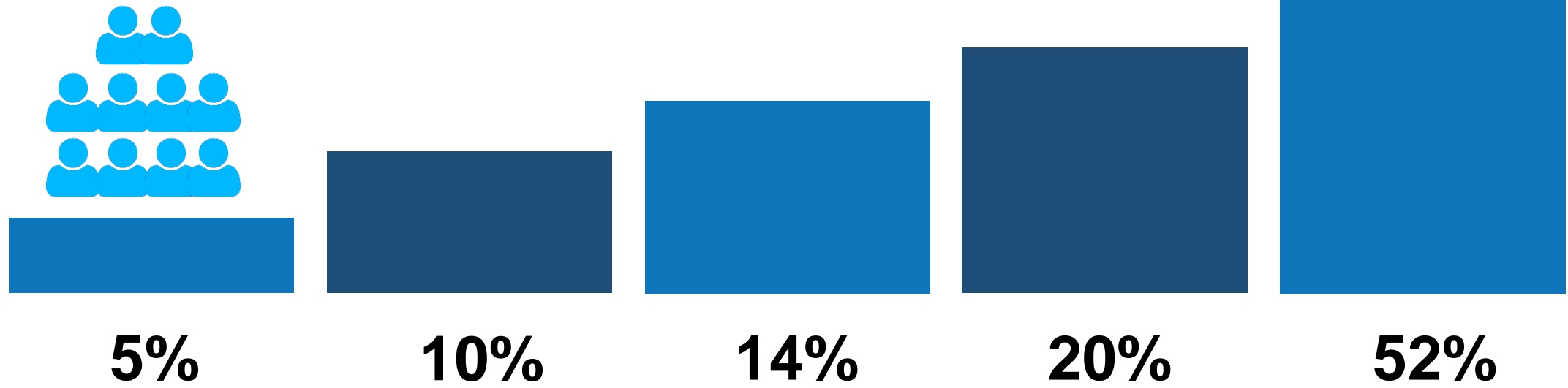

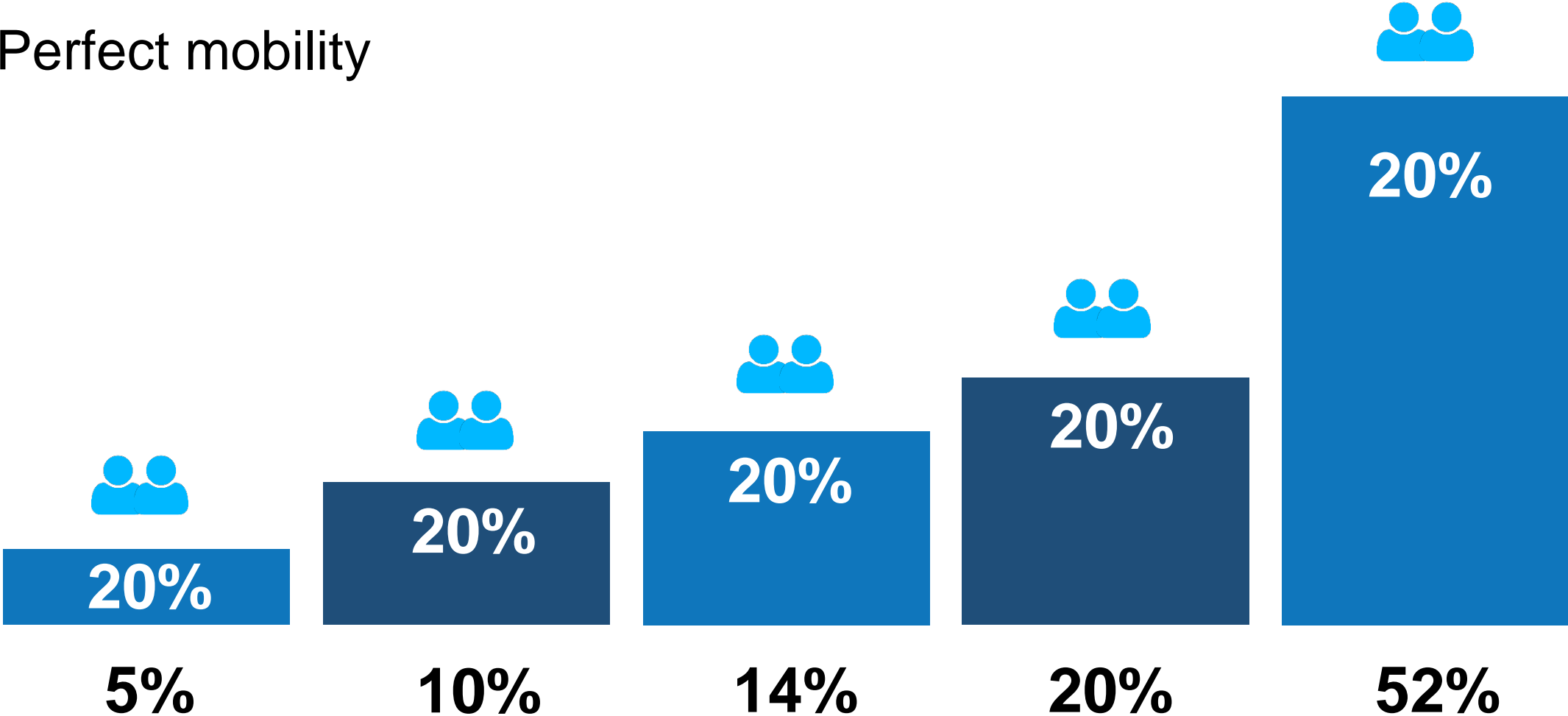
Actual Income Distribution



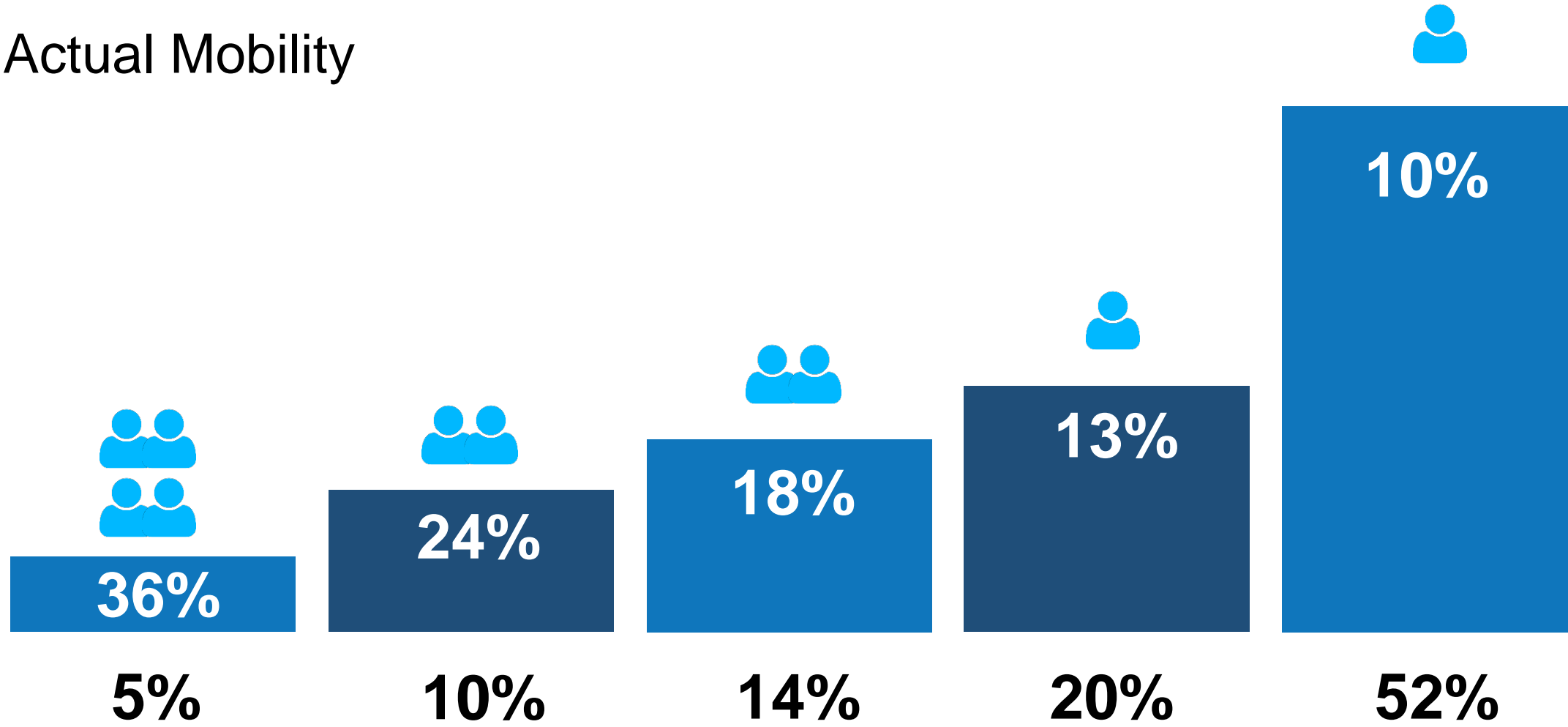

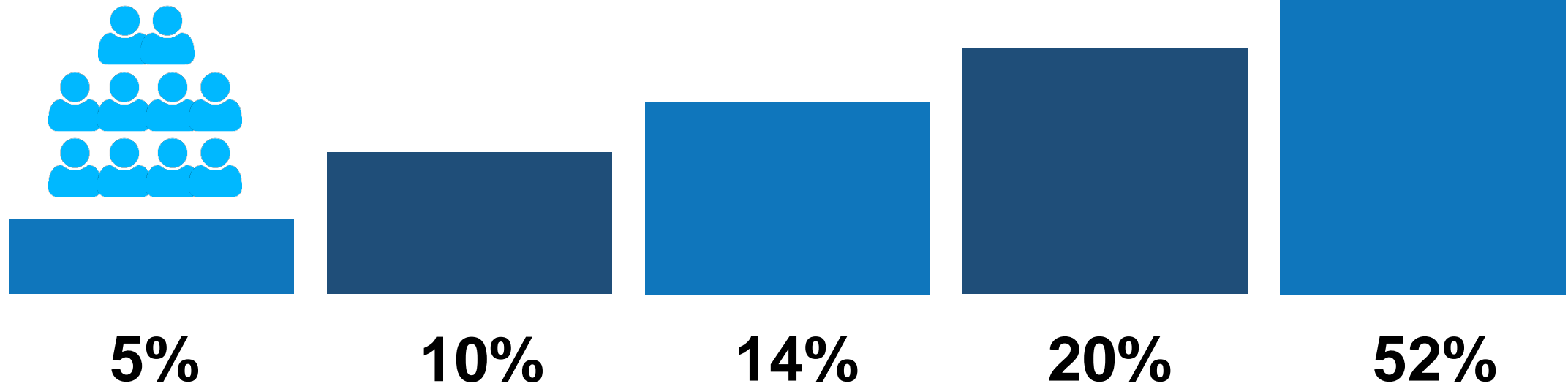

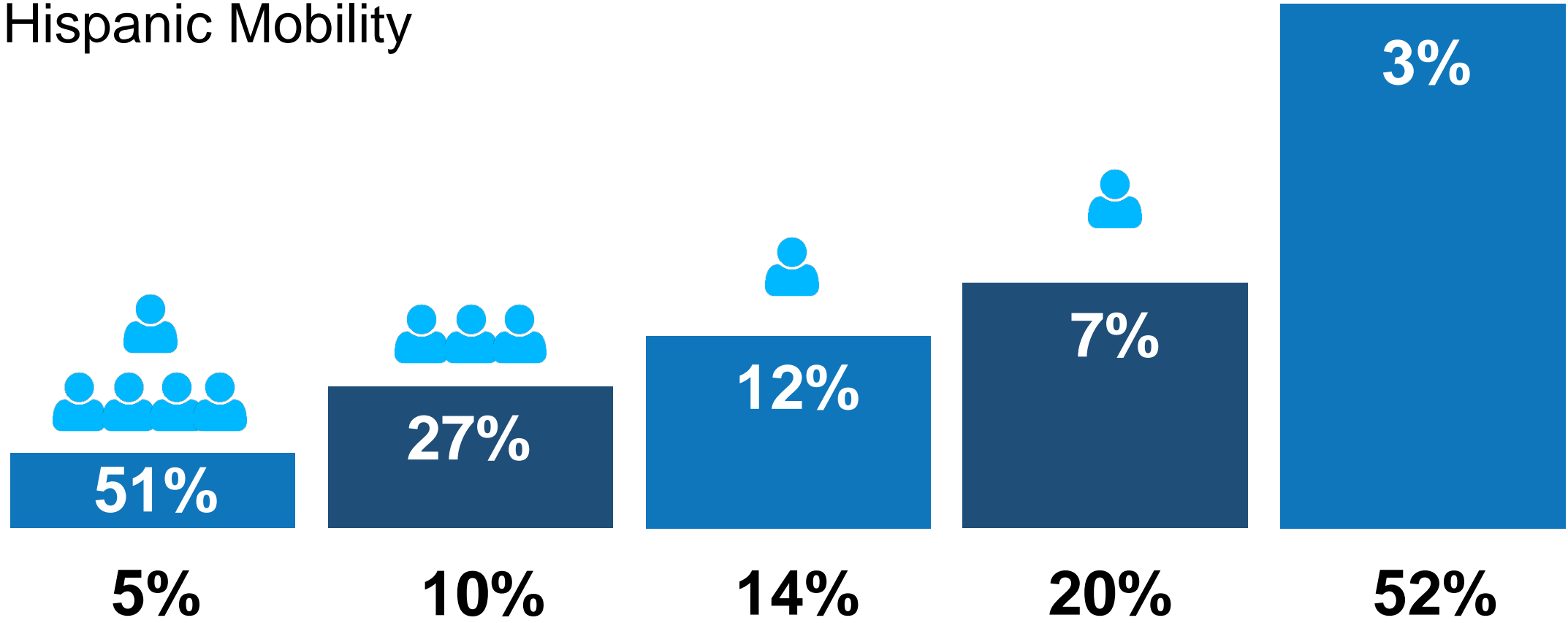

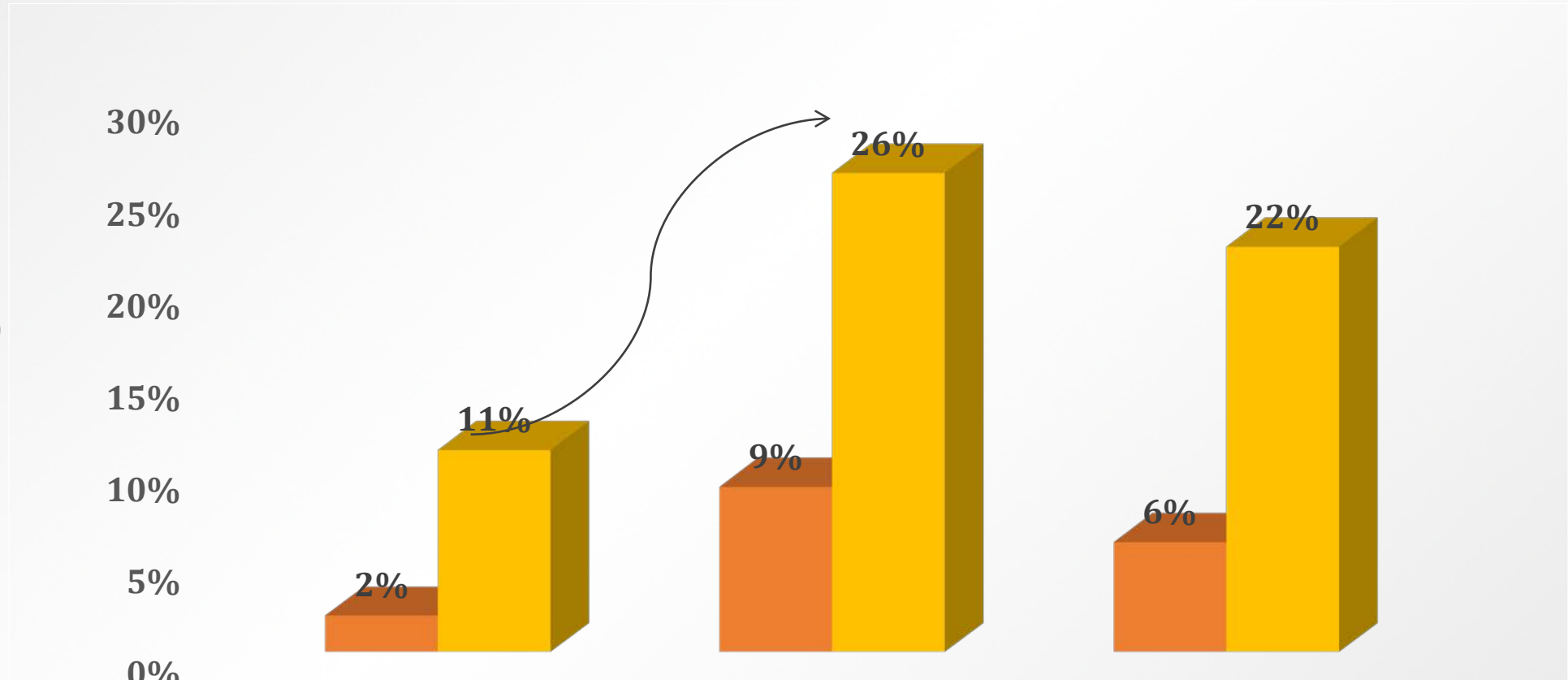

Percentage of students not graduated from high school by age 19



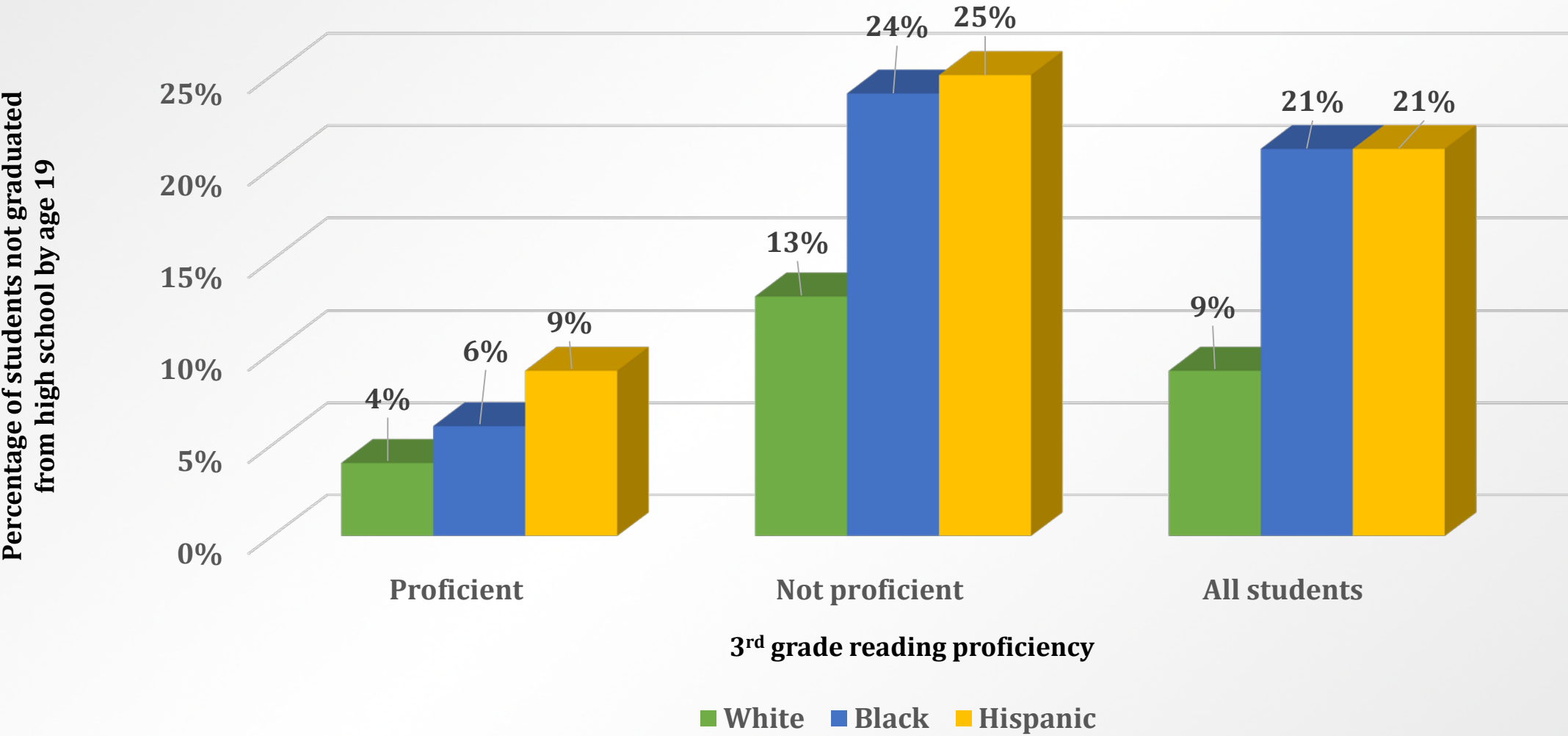

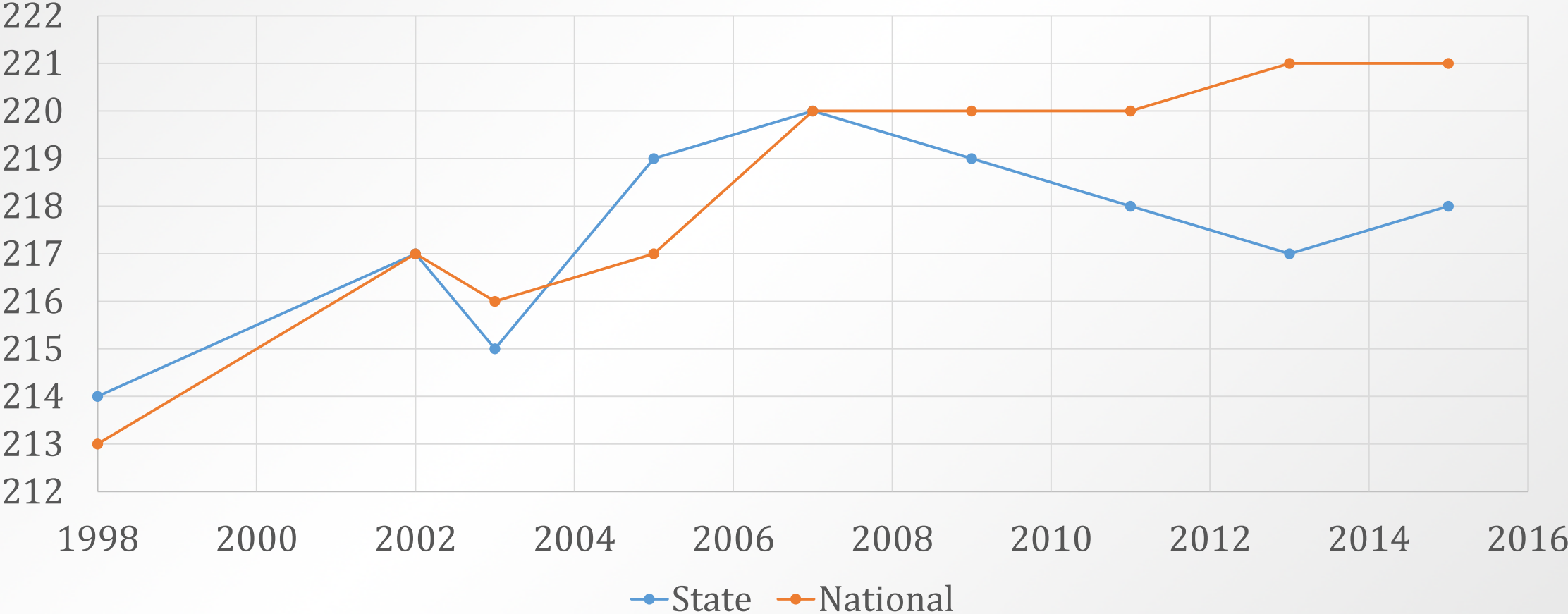

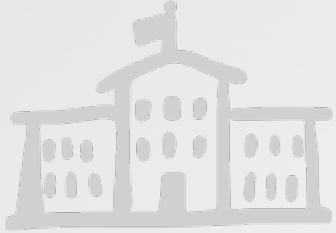
